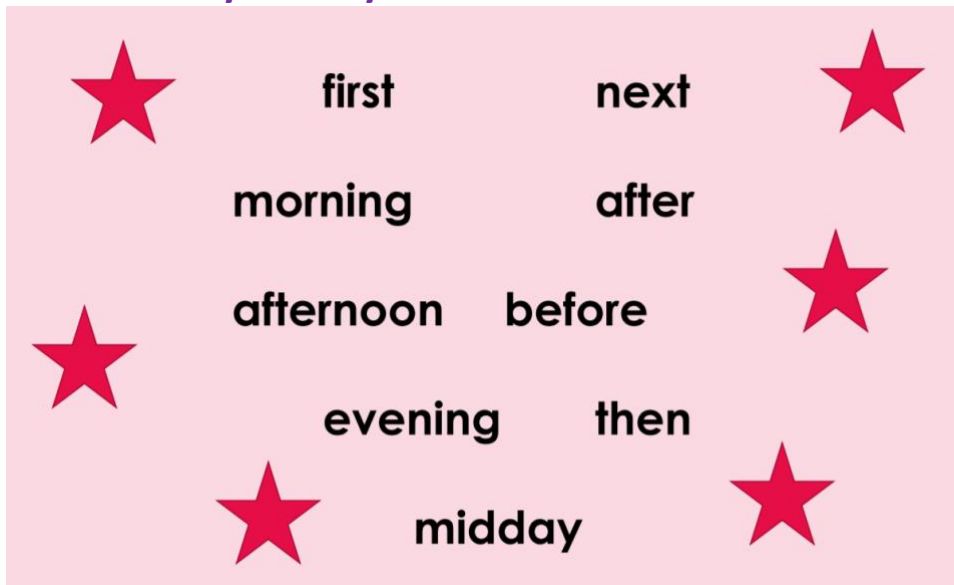

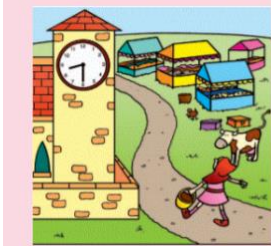

walk the dog



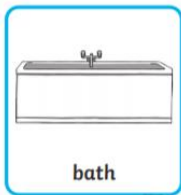
