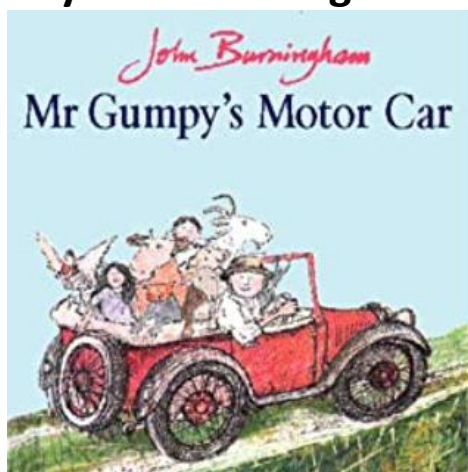

NEW LEARNING: How to imitate and write a text.

1, Look at your story map. Can you tell the story to somebody?

2, Today you will be imitating the story.

Remember – imitate means to learn the text off by heart.

1, Listen to the story again.

2, This is the text we will be learning this week – it is all about the animals in Mr Gumpy's car.

Imitate the text below - remember to put in the actions!

“Not me,” said the goat. “I’m too old.”

“Not me,” said the calf. “I’m too young.”

“Not us,” said the chickens. “We can’t push.”

“Not me,” said the sheep. “I might catch cold.”

“Not me,” said the pig. “I’ve a bone in my trotter.”

“Not me,” said the dog. “But I’ll drive if you like.”

“Not me,” said the cat. “It would ruin my fur.”

“Not me,” said the rabbit. “I’m not very well.”

“Not me,” said the girl. “He’s stronger.”

“Not me,” said the boy. “She’s bigger.”

Mr Welsh: You could try doing a story map to help you with this too.

3, Can you add any words into the map that will help you to remember it?

4, Now practice performing it in the mirror or in front of someone at home. Ask them what you did well and what could be done better. Have you tried to use an animal voice?
