We are painters:

Pupils learn to illustrate an e-book to represent a traditional tale.



Numeracy

Numbers within 10:

Pupils secure their knowledge of numbers to 10. They count sets of objects, represent numbers in different ways and explore number bonds to 1-digit numbers. They compare and order numbers, learn to double and half, and find 1 more/1 less than a given number.

Addition and subtraction (0-10): Pupils explore the relationship between addition and subtraction. They learn to count on and count back to solve when solving number problems.

Shape and Patterns: Pupils explore, identify and classify 2D and 3D shapes. They learn new language to describe position, direction and movement. Pupils create and describe repeating patterns.

Sports: Pupils develop their throwing and catching skills with a range of different size balls and objects.

Health: Pupils explore the functions of body parts and why it is important to lead a healthy lifestyle.

Autumn 1 – Year 1

R.E Hinduism: Pupils explore Hindu stories about the Gods, including Rama and Sita; the childhood of Krishna and Ganesh. They learn the importance of key values.

Music Voice: Pupils explore how they can use their voice expressively, while establishing a sense of pulse, rhythm and pitch. They explore and learn different melodies and tempos.

Spanish Pupils develop everyday vocabulary for colours, using this to describe objects.

Geography My Local Area

What is it like to live in our local area?

Pupils investigate maps, zooming in from a world view to locate our country, city, borough and school location. They use maps to find features of the local area and create their own maps to represent these. Pupils explore the different ways we travel in the city, the journeys we take, and the jobs people do in the local community.

D&T Self-portraits: Pupils will learn to create images that represent their own appearance and personality, paying attention to the scale of facial features.

Our value this half term: Aspiration

Science: Everyday Materials

Pupils explore the different materials in their local environment. They identify and sort materials by their properties and discover their uses. They investigate to find the best material for building a house to escape from the Big Bad Wolf!

Literacy

Core text: The Three Little Pigs

Traditional tales: Pupils read The Three Little Pigs and other traditional tales. They identify repeated phrasing and use this to compose their own traditional stories.

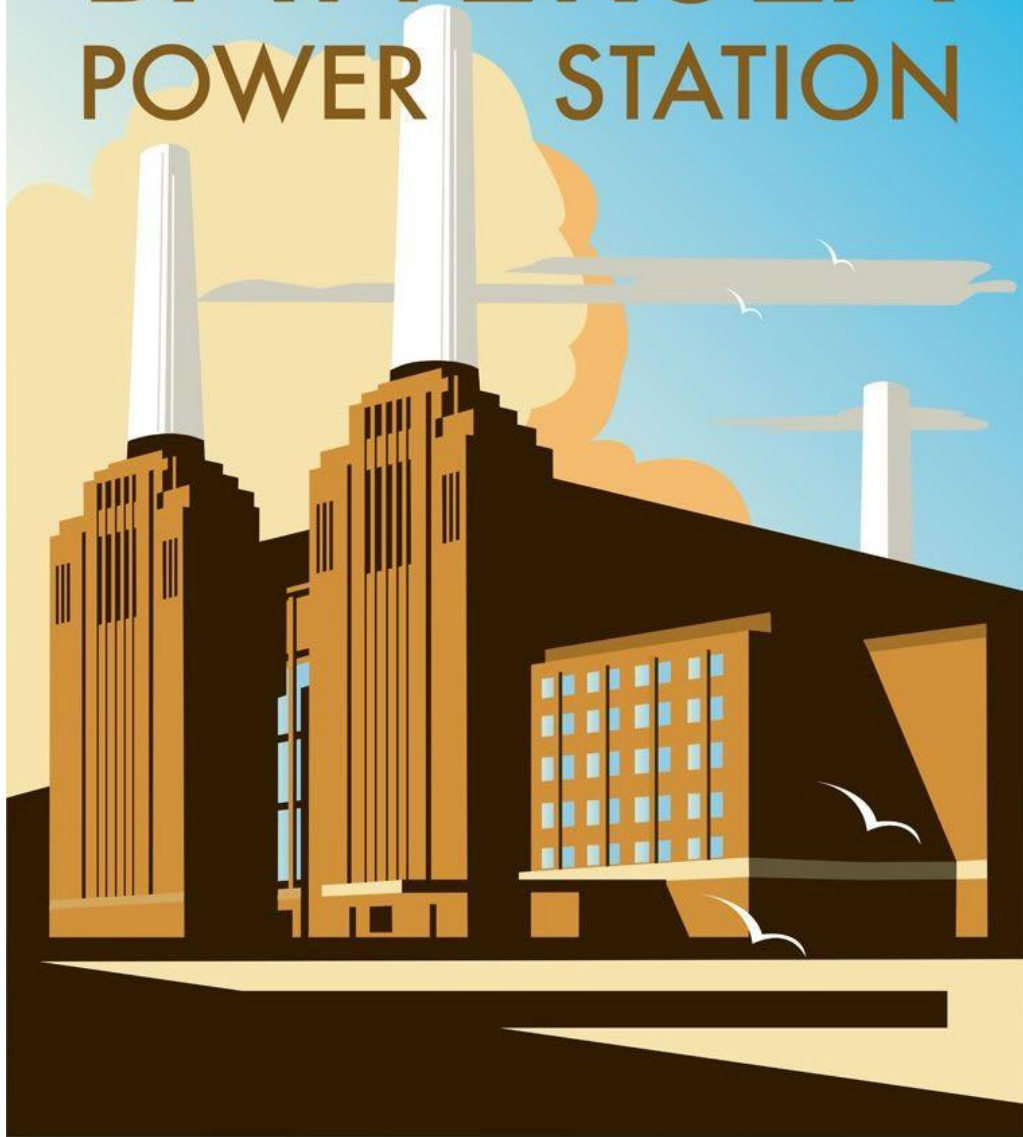
Recount: Pupils draw upon their own experiences to recount a trip in the local area. They recall key events, including how they travelled and the materials they discovered.

Reading: Pupils continue to learn Set 2 and 3 sounds in phonics, applying these to read with increased fluency. They apply sounds when writing.

Handwriting: Pupils practise and improve letter formation, orientation and size.

PSHE Keeping safe: Pupils discover ways we can keep ourselves safe in the local community. They explore how to recognise when people are being kind / unkind to them and how best to respond.
